

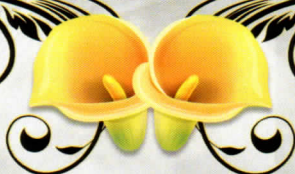

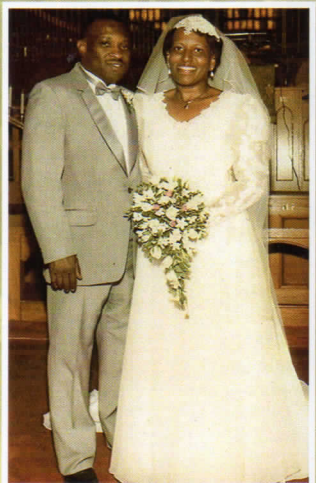
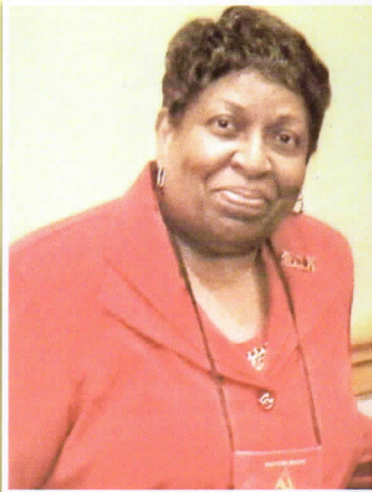
HOPE LEE FOREMAN HENRY

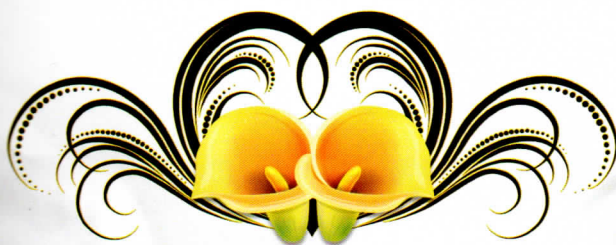
Hope Lee Henry, 71, returned to her heavenly home on November 10, 2017 after a valiant battle with a long illness. She received the Lord as her personal Savior and for many years was a member of Camphor Memorial United Methodist Church in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Hope was born to the late Charles and Dorothy Foreman and was the oldest of three children. She graduated from Yeadon High School and continued her education at West Chester University to obtain a Bachelor of Science with a concentration in Special Education. Her career began as a special education teacher in the Chester-Upland School District. Hope returned to West Chester University to obtain a Masters of Education in School Counseling and worked for the Chester-Upland School District for twenty-one years of her professional career. She was a life-long learner and continued to take courses at Temple University where she met the love of her life, her husband, Clyde. In September 1984, Hope and Clyde united in marriage and their union was blessed with two children, Clyde, Jr. and Whitney. When her husband, Clyde, a United Methodist Pastor transferred to the Western Pennsylvania Conference, she moved to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania with her family and continued her career. She spent fifteen years as a high school counselor and also served as Director of the Career Center for the Woodland Hills School District. After retirement, Hope moved back to the Philadelphia-area in order to spend time with her family. She was very active, even in retirement, she worked for Vision for Equality, an agency that advocates for individuals with disabilities. She was known for being very giving, kind and family oriented. She is dearly missed by her loved ones, who celebrate the fact that she is at peace.

Hope was a lifetime member of the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc., where she served as Basileus and First Anti-Basileus of the Zeta Chapter and the Nominations Chairperson for the Eastern Region. She was also a member of the National Association of University Women and National Council of Negro Women.

Hope leaves behind to cherish her memory: her husband, Clyde; her children, Sandra (Kevin, Sr.), Clyde and Whitney; two brothers, Charles and Howard; Brother-in-laws; David (Doreen), Trevor (Marva), and Samuel; her grandchildren Alanna and Simone; her step-grandchildren, Fatimah, Kevin, Jr. and Kristopher; Niece and nephews, Trish, Francis, Henry and Christopher; a host of extended family, cousins, other relatives, Sorors, church members and friends.
