Life Sketch

Hewitt Ashmede Scully, the first born of the union of George and Othilda Scully entered this world on October 4th 1943 at Bois Content, St. Catherine, Jamaica, West Indies.

Hewitt, fondly called "Papsy", graduated Old Harbour Primary School and shortly thereafter went to work at Old Harbour Ice Factory moving swiftly through the ranks to the position of manager. In 1963, he went on to work for British Insulated Cables Cable (BICC) Ltd. as production foreman until he decided to migrate to the United States.

In 1964 Hewitt met Hyanty, his first love and swept her off her feet. The union blossomed and flowered three beautiful children, Juliet (Kim), Miriam (Jackie) and Micheal (Steve).

Hewitt later met Clover and from that union produced a beautiful daughter Shernette.

Several years later, Hewitt entered into a union with Ena Lewis and created three wonderful lives in Roger, Richard and Roshelle.

Hewitt loved and adored his children. He worked hard and tirelessly and was a good provider. Hewitt was a firm believer in education. He encouraged his children to stay in school, work hard and to be the best they can be.

Hewitt was always kind and generous to his younger siblings. Being the oldest, he would assist his parents by caring for his siblings and kept them from harm. He was very protective, and was quick to take the blame for their transgressions.

He was instrumental in helping his brothers to gain employment. He took his younger brother Lloyd under his wings and played a major role in him obtaining a position as supervisor at BICC, where they worked side by side.

Hewitt never showed anger to his brothers, even after his baby brother Winston took his favorite bicycle without his knowledge. At the age of nine, Winston fell off his bike in front of an oncoming truck. By God's grace, the driver was able to stop the truck in the nick of time. Hewitt simply exhorted him to be more careful.

Hewitt was an avid fan of horse racing (His favorite hobby), and as an owner of several horses, he became a fixture at Caymanas Park in Jamaica. If he went missing, that's where you would find him, watching the horses race.

In 1984, Hewitt embarked on a journey which was to take him to the Bronx, New York, in the United States, where he worked with several carpet companies as a professional carpet installer. He excelled at his job and went on to become a business owner with a fleet of 2 trucks and 16 employees. His success enabled him to take very good care of his family.

Seven years ago Hewitt entered into retirement, and his love of dominoes and people led him to become a regular patron of Klassique Lounge in the Bronx, where he interacted with many other patrons as he enjoyed his well-deserved time of relaxation in the sunset of his later years on this wonderful earth.

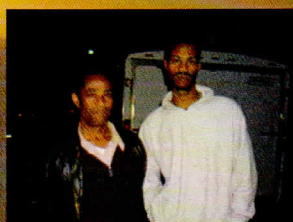
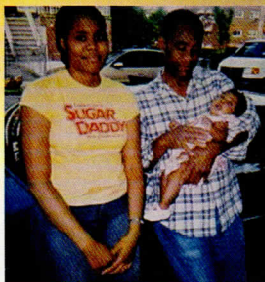
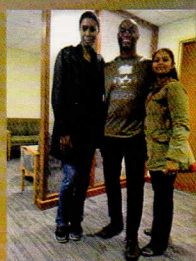
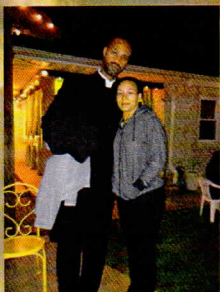
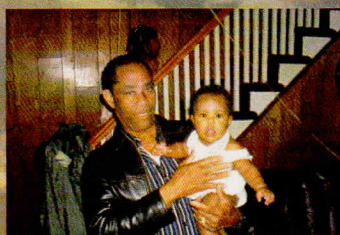

All filled with tears for me.*

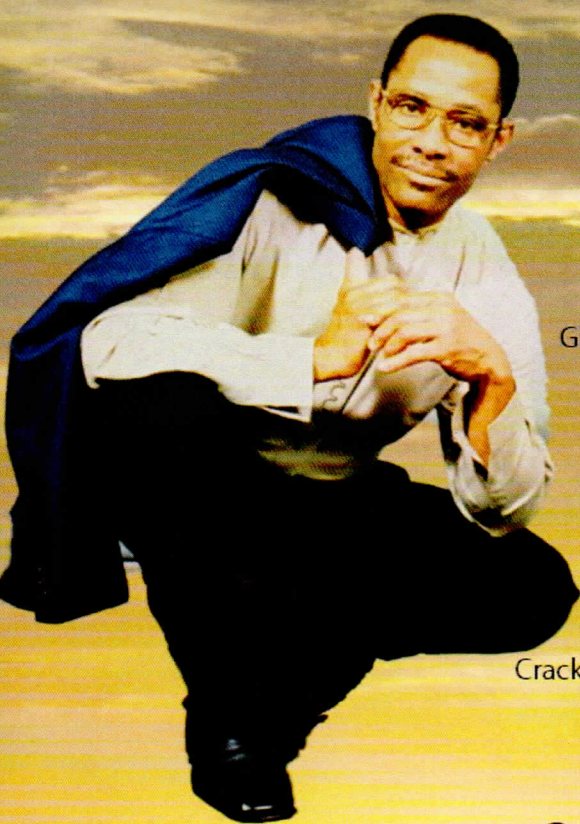
*I wish so much you wouldn't cry
