When Frances' health failed, she was lovingly cared for by her niece, Brenda E. Brister.

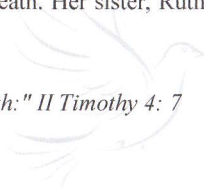
Frances will was a member of Zerubbabel Court #6, Ladies of the Circle of Perfection and Minaret Court #154.
