

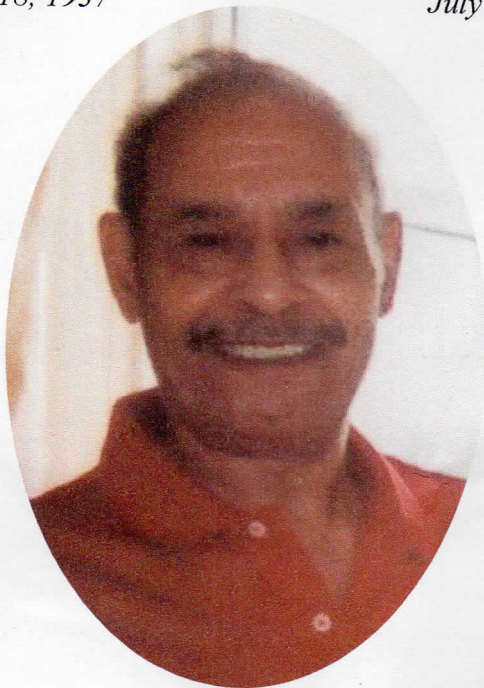

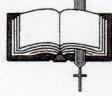

With memories of the times we danced,

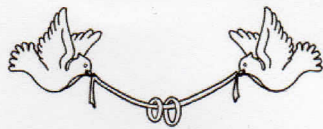
Laughed and held each other close
