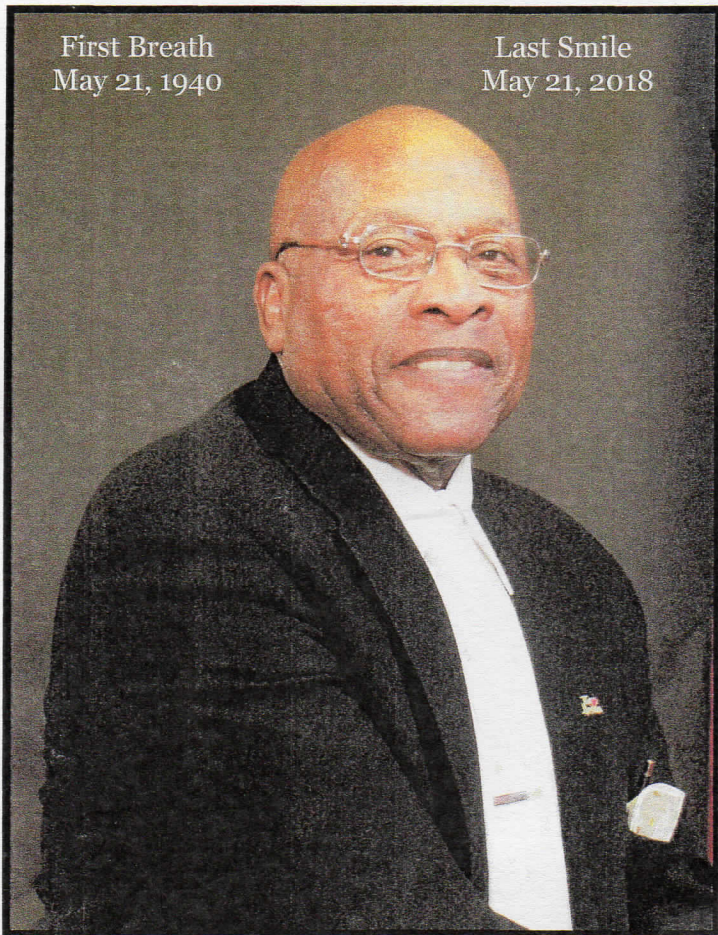

# Obituary

**Freddie G. Wyatt** was born to the late Eula Wyatt in Churchview, Middlesex County, Virginia on May 21, 1940. From an early age, Freddie attended Mount Zion Baptist Church in Churchview with his mother and family. He accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized at Mount Zion by Reverend Gayle. At the age of 10, Freddie's mother passed, and he was lovingly raised by his aunt, Gayzelle Wyatt.

After graduating high school, Freddie remained and worked in Virginia. In 1968, he moved to Pottstown, PA where he worked in the steel mills. At the suggestion of a friend, Freddie left Pottstown and moved to the Philadelphia area. He worked for a while at the Ryan & Christie Moving Company in Bryn Mawr. In 1973, Freddie was hired full time by the Lower Merion Township where he worked faithfully until his retirement in 2000. While working for Lower Merion Township, Freddie received a commendation for his commitment to providing quality service to the residents of the township.

Freddie joined Millennium Baptist Church in 1983 and remained an active and faithful member until his health prevented him from attending. Under the leadership of the late Pastor David L. Waller, Sr., Freddie was ordained as a deacon at Millennium. Deacon Freddie Wyatt was a humble man, never needing or wanting recognition. However, on October 28, 2012, Deacon Wyatt was recognized by former Pastor Clarence J. Washington of Millennium, for being a "*Faithful, Spiritual Servant*". Although he never sought it, this was an acknowledgement that he valued. He was full of the wisdom of God and he never shield away from sharing his testament of how God bestowed His blessings in his life.

He will be remembered as a man of honor, integrity, a man who was generous in his giving, one who was committed to serve, and one who loved people. Some might call him a warrior; he never gave up and always kept pressing forward. Others may recount the faith he affirmed even up to his last day on this earth. He did not fear death because he knew that "*to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord*" (2 Corinthians 5:8) His love for the Lord and the trust he proclaimed in Him will be a lasting testimony to many.

Freddie leaves to cherish and celebrate his memory, his cousin, Betsy Davenport King, extend family, his church family, and a host of friends.
